Midlands Air Ambulance Inspires Pupils

Pupils at St Peter's School were treated to an inspiring and informative visit from the Midlands Air Ambulance Charity before Easter, as part of a special event to raise awareness ahead of the school's Easter fundraising activities.

Kay, a representative from the Midlands Air Ambulance team, brought along a Helipod—a detailed model of the life-saving helicopter—to give pupils a closer look at the intricate and vital work the charity performs every day. The Helipod allowed pupils to explore the interior of an air ambulance and understand the critical care capabilities it carries into emergencies.



Presenting to both Year 12 and Year 8 pupils, Kay delivered a powerful session about the role of the Air Ambulance service, the types of incidents they attend, and how their rapid response saves lives across the Midlands. Her talk shed light on the immense coordination, skill, and funding required to keep the charity flying.

The visit served not only as an educational opportunity but also as a motivating start to the school's Easter fundraising week. Pupils left the sessions with a greater appreciation for the charity's incredible work and a renewed enthusiasm for supporting such an important cause.

Pupils in Years 9 to 11 had the valuable opportunity to see a live performance of their GCSE text An Inspector Calls at the Alexandra Theatre in Birmingham. Taking place just days before the Year 11 Literature exam, the trip proved to be a timely and powerful way to reinforce pupils' understanding of the play. Seeing the characters brought to life on stage helped deepen their grasp of key themes, dramatic techniques, and character motivations. The experience was both educational and enriching, particularly for those preparing to sit their final exam.

Intentionally Loving

The Scholars Programme – The Brilliant Club

This year, 2 groups of our high-achieving pupils have taken part in The Scholars Programme, run by the national education charity The Brilliant Club. Designed to give pupils an insight into university-style learning, the programme pairs pupils with a PhD researcher who delivers a series of challenging tutorials on a topic linked to their academic specialism. Students produce final assignments assessed at a level above their current key stage and attend a graduation event to celebrate their achievements, encouraging participants to aim high and consider future study at top universities.



Year 10 Graduation

Our Spring cohort of Year 10 Scholars have been working hard since January using the supervision of their tutor Melanie Woodhead, on their Scholar's programme: How might plant-based photography reframe our experiences of climate change? This has been a wonderful opportunity for them to explore a concept completely outside their current experience, and they have risen to the academic challenge wonderfully. By the end of the programme each had to produce a 2000 research-based and referenced essay, providing them with a host of skills that will prepare them for their future A-level studies. They attended their graduation at the University of Birmingham on 20th May, accompanied by Mrs Hutchings & Mr Kierney. They had a tour of the campus, a chance to ask questions of current pupils and were able to reflect on their future pathway options (and were very impressed at the number of food options available on campus!). The pupils have been an absolute credit to the school during this process and I hope they will move forwards with the confidence and experience that befits our Scholars.

Meanwhile our Summer cohort of Year 8 pupils are in the process of completing their final assignments for their programme entitled: Engineering: Can you shape your city? These young scholars are completing a 1,250 word research-based essay, and will be learning about referencing and how to improve their work following 1-2-1 feedback from their tutor. This is unlike anything they have been asked to do before, and they are all working incredibly hard on this challenge. Once these assignments are completed, they will be attending their own graduation ceremony in July

Recycle Your Used Pens

While there is no specific statistic for the exact number of pens binned annually in UK schools, it is clear that the UK education sector contributes to a significant amount of waste, estimated at roughly 210,700 tonnes each year. Many of these materials, including empty glue sticks and old pens, are not recycled and ultimately end up in landfills or incinerators. To combat this issue, we are offering pupils the opportunity to recycle their old pens, mechanical pencils, whiteboard pens, and more in every St Peter's classroom. Pupils should keep an eye out for the designated recycling boxes that will be appearing in classrooms shortly. Pens will then be taken to Ryman's stationary store for recycling.

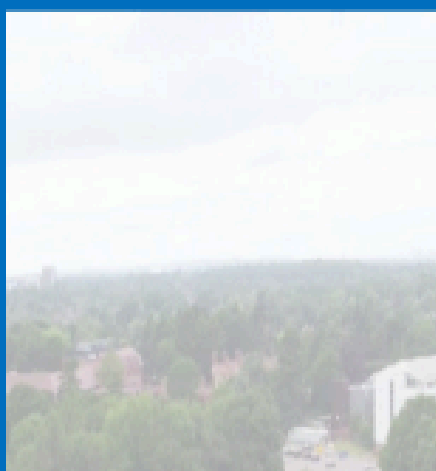

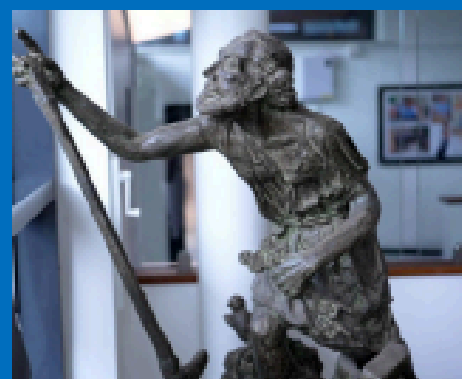
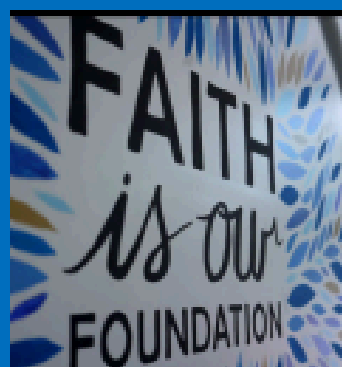
