


# Why is literacy important?

- Reading skills are a predictor of attainment in all subjects at GCSE.
- Weak reading skills make it difficult for pupils to access the curriculum.
- Reading regularly helps to expand vocabulary, understand context and become a better communicator.
- Reading for pleasure has benefits for mental health.



# National Literacy Trust research

- Our latest research shows us how important reading is as a method for nourishing one's mental health and wellbeing. 3 in 5 individuals aged 5 to 18 said that they read because it relaxed them, and nearly 1 in 2 read because it made them feel happy.

Reading can help everyone and is a great way to:

- Relax, unwind and boost their mood
- Escape from the pressures of life and reduce their stress levels
- Improve your memory and concentration





## Find fiction to extend your learning in **Art**




### Frank Cottrell Boyce, *Framed*


### Kim Slater, *Smart*




**Malorie Blackman, *Hacker***


**Jo Simmons, *I swapped my Brother on the Internet***

When Brodie receives a coded message through the post her life changes for ever. She's drawn into a secret code and cipher society trying to crack the most complicated code in the world.




**Keren David, *The Disconnect***




### Philip Reeve, *Mortal Engines*


### Malorie Blackman, *Operation Gadgetman!*




### Laurel Remington, *The Secret Cooking Club*




**Kiran Millwood Hargrave, *The Girl of Ink and Stars***


**Eoin Colfer & Andrew Donkin, *Illegal* (Graphic Novel)**

This explores the current plight of undocumented immigrants. Ebo is alone. His brother has disappeared, and Ebo is attempting the journey to Europe.




**Emily Diamond, *Flood Child***




### Cathy Brett, *Everything is Fine*


### Michael Morpurgo, *Private Peaceful*

Private Thomas Peaceful is only eighteen but he has seen the horrors of war and experienced the full weight of its unfairness.




### Paul Dowsnell, *Sektion 20*

Nastia is a daring pilot, and as Russia enters WWII, she must fight for the motherland. But when the battle begins, long-held secrets are revealed.




### L'Engle, Madeleine, *A Wrinkle in Time*


### Holly Smale, *Geek Girl*


### Wendy Lichtman, *Secrets, Lies and Algebra*


### Hans Enzensberger, *The Number Devil*




### Mark Haddon, *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time* KS4+

A story told through Christopher's eyes: an autistic boy gifted with numbers. Contains mathematical theorems and lots of prime numbers!




### James Patterson, *Middle School: Born to Rock*


### Jerry Spinelli, *Stargirl*




### Rainbow Rowell, *Eleanor & Park* KS4+




### Katherine Rundell, *Rooftoppers*


### Sally Gardner, *The Red Necklace*




### Michael Morpurgo, *Toro! Toro!*


### Kwame Alexander, *Booked*


### Tom Palmer, *Foul Play*

A school boy investigates the disappearance of his team's leading player.




### Nat Luurtsema, *Girl Out of Water*

Lou Brown was on track to Olympic stardom but now she's a social outcast trying to get by at school. Will she find happiness and friendship with the cool boys who want her to train them?




### Tom Palmer, *Armistice Runner*





It is Earth year 2213—but, of course, there is no Earth anymore. Not since it was burned to a cinder by the sun, which has mysteriously begun the process of going supernova.




### Christopher Edge, *The Many Worlds of Albie Bright*

When Natalie's science teacher suggests that she enter an egg drop competition, Natalie thinks that this might be the perfect solution to all of her problems. Contains depression.




### Jenny McLachlan, *Stargazing for Beginners*




### Muhammad Khan, *I am Thunder*


### Brandy Colbert, *Little & Lion*


### Judy Blume, *Are you there God? It's me, Margaret*
